

Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium Funding Plan 2017-18

What is it?

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium is to provide extra support for pupils in Year 7 who have not met the expected standard in English or Maths. This is based on their KS2 score and any student below a score of 100 is deemed to be not yet secondary ready.

How much does our school get?

The literacy and numeracy catch up premium for the 2017 to 2018 school year is £18,000. This is to support 40 students for numeracy and 49 students for literacy.

How is the Catch Up Premium Funding spent?

There are a number of ways in which the School uses this funding to improve the standards of English or Maths for the identified group of pupils. The breakdown of the proposed spending can be seen below.

Nurture Group	£5000	To provide intensive small group support over the course of the year to improve literacy and numeracy.	14
Literacy Groups	£1000	To provide short-term, targeted support for identified pupils who are not making the required standard in English.	30
EAL Literacy Groups	£1300	To improve literacy where EAL was a barrier to success	12
Mentoring	£1000	To support the progress of pupils in literacy and numeracy, including building self confidence	8
2x TAs and Class Size - Maths	£5000	To provide a smaller number of students in the lowest set in Y7 and to place two TAs in that group for additional support	20
Accelerated reader – provision and targeted reading sessions	£2000	To provide regular reading materials and focused reading groups to develop literacy/reading skills	49
Small group numeracy intervention	£3000	Targeted groups using Maths TA and Maths teacher in registration time to develop numeracy competence.	20
