Last term we opened a sparkling new Main Hall and Reception that has brought Wexham into the 21st Century.

Now work is well underway on our fantastic new building. This will house English, MFL and Humanities with some much needed new toilets. Also included is a dedicated student welfare and medical centre and a state of the art two storey library and sixth form area.

The new building will accommodate the rise in student numbers when we expand from six Forms of Entry to eight in 2018 and allow for the demolition of the existing (much loathed and loved by some) Fowler Block.



We will also see our current library transformed into two new science laboratories. This new investment is thanks to Slough Borough Council, Slough Urban Renewal and Morgan Sindall.

We are extremely grateful to them for providing us with an amazing new building. Along with our superb sports hall, dance and drama studios, creative arts and technology areas we really will have some of the best facilities to educate our students, all set in a spacious and green 'campus' environment. Riotous explosion of samba-filled dance

Wexham School GCSE dancers were given the opportunity to watch the Rambert Dance Company's performance of A Linha Curva at Sadlers Wells Theatre in London.

A Linha Curva is Rambert's party piece: a

riotous explosion of colourful, samba-fuelled dance. The work features 28 performers, a massed bank of percussion and dramatic lighting – the cumulative effect had the Wexham



students on their feet and cheering. A Linha Curva was nominated for the 2010 Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Dance Production, and helped Rambert win the Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in Dance that year for its programme of

new works.


For many of the students this was their first visit to a live theatre but they said it wouldn't be their last.

Y7 Latin scholars in partnership with Cambridge University

With a 50 year history of development and revision, the Cambridge Latin Course (CLC) has established itself as the leading beginner's course for Latin.

Aims of the Course

- to teach comprehension of the Latin language for reading purposes;
- to develop an understanding of the history and culture of Roman civilisation;
- to encourage a wide range of approaches to language learning through the use of high quality audio-visual resources.

Recent lectures have included Mr. Clark presenting to over 100 trainee teachers on Behaviour for Learning in schools.



My interest and love of mathematics grew whilst I



programmes. One of the programmes available will be Game of their Own, a KS3/4 programme




encouraging girls to become Football Activators in their school and engage other peer groups and support football activity throughout the school.

Forms challenged to number quiz

Wexham School's Mathematics department are promoting numeracy across the school. Numeracy involves being able to think and communicate quantitatively; making sense of data; understanding patterns and sequences as well as being able to recognise situations where

mathematical reasoning can be applied to solve problems.

The Mathematics department are running a weekly



numeracy competition for Year 7 to Year 10. The activity is to answer a set of 10 challenging questions as a form class. Results are then collated at the end of the week. Each half term the form class from each year group with the highest score will be awarded a trophy.




Gruesome, electrifying and explosive

The year 10 were privy to the assembly given by myself on ownership and a lot of them have remembered the importance of this. They may not want for that Maserati anymore! The value of science is now becoming apparent to them.

The weeks pass for the year

11 as they start thinking about how much science can I actually remember from year 10. They have



experienced change and have started to appreciate that whatever it takes to achieve will now have to be done. They will have to give up a lot but they will gain a lot when they leave with that GCSE in Triple or Combined

Science.

Our year 12 and 13 have made that step from year 11 to year 12 and year 12 to 13. They have experienced change but not hesitated in their efforts to perform to the best of their ability.

The science department would like to say a thank you for all your efforts and will continue to support you in your journey to the frontiers of science.

On a final note.....

Open evening was one of our many great successes demonstrated by the gruesome world of biology, the explosive nature of chemistry and the electrifying department of physics!!

Science Activity: Speed-Air resistance

In a recent Science lesson some of our students were being taught about the topic of speed and how to calculate speed using the relevant formulae.

In this activity the students were investigating the difference in speed while running with and without a parachute.

Our students worked in pairs; one student had a stop watch and the other student had to run. The student with the stop watch had to time the other person to run 30m.

The students ran 30m once without a parachute



and then once with a parachute.

Results were recorded onto a table that was given to each student. From this activity the students discovered that with the parachute they took longer to run 30m compared to when they ran without a parachute.

The students determined that the reason for this happening was because the parachutes experience more air resistance.

The students relished the opportunity of taking part in practical learning and this is a feature we promote in all of our department areas at Wexham School.

Inspirational science

During the summer term lecturer Susan Mayes from the University of Reading visited the school and presented an assembly for Year 9 students regarding "careers in chemistry"

The inspirational presentation included information regarding the facilities that Reading University has to offer, and explained to Wexham students about why chemistry is important in

everyday life and how rewarding a career in chemistry can be.

Susan remarked afterwards that it was evident that these students showed a lot of potential in the field of science and was looking forward to continue to work in collaboration with the students of Wexham school to help develop their aspirations in the field of Chemistry.






Talking with confidence

Since September 2017 the EAL Department has welcomed new students arriving from countries including Romania, Italy, Bulgaria, India, Saudi Arabia and Poland. All are settling in well, and with each day passing they have grown more confident when

speaking in English.

At the moment there are 42 students on the EAL register Yr 7 to Yr 11 who receive between 5 to 7 hours of EAL intervention. Yr 10's, are currently

A Linha Curva is Rambert's party piece: a riotous explosion of colourful, samba-fuelled dance. The work features 28 performers, a massed bank of percussion and dramatic lighting – the cumulative effect has audiences on their feet and cheering (once they've got their breath back).



A Linha Curva was nominated for the 2010 Laurence Olivier Award for Best New Dance Production, and helped Rambert win the Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in Dance that year for its programme of new works.

E-SAFETY at Wexham

3. Make sure that all of the friends on their social media accounts are known to your child and you.
4. Disable the location setting on Snapchat. This is a new feature that gives anyone the exact location of your child while they are online.
5. Make sure that you have parental settings on your Wi-Fi to help restrict any unwanted or harmful content.



6. Monitor their use of the internet – children are often online while they are alone in their bedroom.
7. Turn the Wi-Fi off when they go to bed to avoid them accessing harmful content.
8. Speak to them about responsible sharing of content online. Nothing that goes online can be erased.
