EClips is an easy to use online platform that helps students in years 11-13 an opportunity to explore the world of careers, education and employment and be able to make informed decisions about their future. **It provides:**

- Accurate information on over 1400 jobs to help students consider the full range of options
- Live streamed labour market information (LMI) including local vacancies-thus guiding students towards jobs that are in demand.
- Careers linked to school/ college subjects and by 23 A-Z Job groups.
- Details on study options at key stages
- Guidelines to help students prepare for the world of work-Includes CV and Interview preparation tools.
- An interactive career matching tool

Registration Process:

(Students in years 8, 9 and 10 must already have login details, please use those. [Re-register only if you have forgotten user name and password](#))

Step 1. Click the “Registration” Tab and Fill in all your details.

Tick that you accept our Privacy, Cookies and Terms of Use policies. Click “Get Started!”

Step 2. Log into Start

Step 3. Select “I am Studying in Education”

([Your Parents can also create an account for themselves](#)-In **Step 3** parents need to select “I am a Parent and I would like to use start with my children”

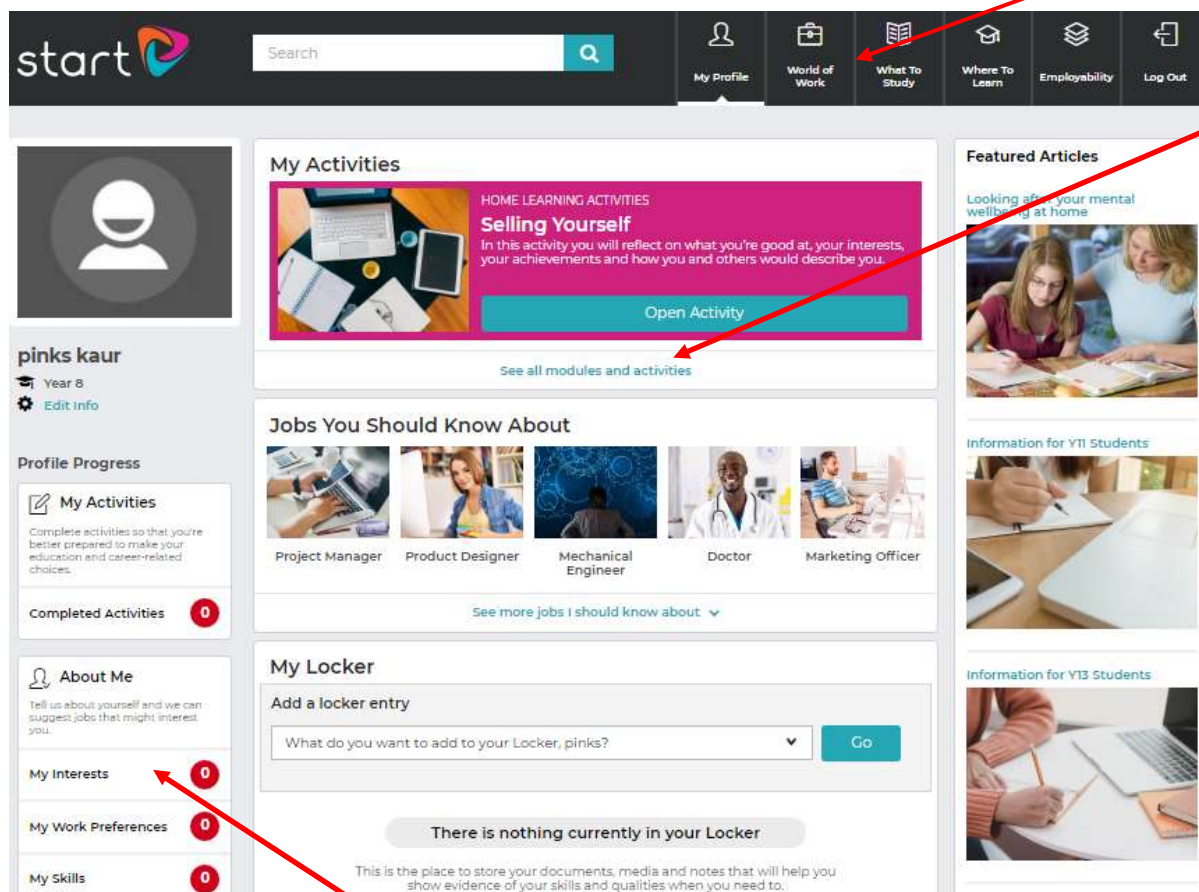
Step 4. Select your School.
