SPELLING 66 BEE FINALS


A huge congratulations to all finalists who took part in the first Wexham Spelling Bee. Every House in years 7 and 8 were represented and the winners of the event are pictured below.



Their work included exposure as industry cadets, designing blue tooth apps for home applications, simplifying routines and connecting to home appliances. They presented the apps to leading industrialists.


