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




Wexham is a non-selective school in a fully selective local authority. This means the vast majority of more able children sit the 11+ and join one of four grammar schools in the town.

Wexham School has the highest number of what the government terms 'disadvantaged' students in Slough (well above the national average) and we have high numbers of students whose first language is not English, many are at the early stages of learning.







Every year we have children achieving the highest grades at Wexham. Every year students from Wexham move on into employment, further training or to universities where they study a broad range of qualifications, including medicine and law. We are exceptionally proud of all our students' achievements; whatever their starting point and whatever their background. We are inclusive and proud to be so.

'Go Ape' Reward Visit














Tutoring to help our students catch up!

This week, they met their tutors for the first time and received the extra level of personalised support that tutoring brings. With the Year 11 PPE examinations round the corner (just after half term), the sessions come at a great time and give these students the best possible preparation for acing their mocks!

We start in the morning with the free student breakfast (This is something every student is entitled to) The breakfast offering ranges from freshly baked pastries to chicken sausages served in a freshly baked baguette. The students then return to see us for their mid-morning break, they will have a choice from marinated chicken wings to a baguette or wrap made fresh by the staff that morning or the option of a hand cut pot of fresh fruit. Then we are on to lunch! Innovate offer a hot main meal to the students which can range from the traditional roast dinner with vegetables, roast potatoes and freshly made Yorkshire puddings (No Aunt Bessies packet yorkshires in our kitchen!)

Thursday is our handmade curry option which could be anything from a Keema curry to a Thai red curry (We offer an option on Halal or Non Halal). We will also have our grab and go pasta pots with our made on site sauces or a choice of Baps/Baguettes/wraps or Hot panini.

All can be washed down with a selection of fruit infused waters or flavoured milks. As the students have worked hard all morning we will have some freshly baked cookies or biscuits for them to reward themselves with on offer throughout the day.

We keep our menus fresh and seasonal so there is something for everyone every day of the school week!
