


THE WINNER TAKES IT ALL IN RECENT YEAR 11 PPES



Recently, all of our Sixth form students attended the Safe Drive Stay Alive conference that took place at the Hexagon Theatre in Reading.

Safe Drive Stay Alive is about making young people aware of the many dangers they face and the impact of their actions behind the wheel on themselves, their friends, family, and also the emergency services that deal with them.

This conference was an eye-opener for our students and gave them a clear indication of how to be responsible road users. It was a success and hopefully, we can continue educating the sixth formers in the coming years.







Tchoukball at Wexham!

This term we introduced Tchoukball into the Core PE curriculum for Years 9, 10 and 11. Tchoukball is a mixed-gender, non-contact sport. There is no tackling, blocking or obstruction of players and no interception of passes allowed, which means that players of different height and build can play together without impacting their game. The main skills needed to play tchoukball are the ability to catch and throw the ball. The attacking team (with possession of the ball) aims to score a point by shooting the ball at the net of the tchoukball frame so that it rebounds and touches the ground.

The defending team's role is to prevent it from touching the ground by catching it. A couple of photos are attached showing some of our Year 11 students having their first experience of playing Tchoukball in PE this week.

Year 12 Virtual Work Experience

Mohammed SHEIKH-OMAR from Year 12 Luther King attended a 5 day virtual work experience with SCS Railways (Skanska Costain STRABAG Joint Venture).

This work experience was about careers and pathways available in Infrastructure. Omar said of his experience:

"Currently SCS Railways are constructing the biggest railway since the Victorian era in the UK. During my work experience we had to design a train line and we also looked at the benefits it would provide and where we would get the funds from. It was really interesting and it improved my confidence level and also improved my teamwork and problem-solving skills. I really enjoyed it. I learnt more about civil engineering and what would be going on in a massive project like this. This experience was very beneficial for me as I would want to be involved in a massive project like this one day."

The theme of the session was based on Bullying and PSHE.








Harry Potter reading Challenge

The Climate Detectives





This year the Geography department have entered a team of students into an International Climate detective STEM competition run by the European Space agency. The team have called themselves the 'Guardians of the Ice caps'. The competition requires students to investigate a local climate issue and try and make a difference to reduce the issue. Our team have decided to investigate how much food waste the school produces and from this how many carbon emissions we add to the atmosphere. The team's overall goal to try and reduce the amount of food waste we are producing to reduce our contribution to climate change.

Scientists have all of the solutions!





Mr Gbesemete and Mr Obajemu hosted the STEM club this week. We looked at convection, conduction and radiation using tea bags, and balloons with water in. After emptying the tea out from the bags, we made a tube & set light to the top. When you set fire to the tea bag, the heat from the fire causes the air molecules inside the tea bag to become energized and move around quickly. The air molecules inside the tea bag are moving so fast that they spread up and out of the tea bag bringing light matter with it. When water inside the balloon is placed in the flame, the water absorbs most of the heat from the flame. Then, the rubber of the balloon does not become very hot. Because the rubber does not become hot, it does not weaken, and the balloon does not break Actually we did break quite a few balloons trying to get this right!
