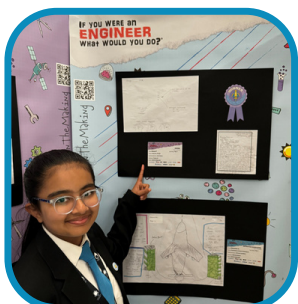
Celebrating Our Star Student's Incredible Achievement

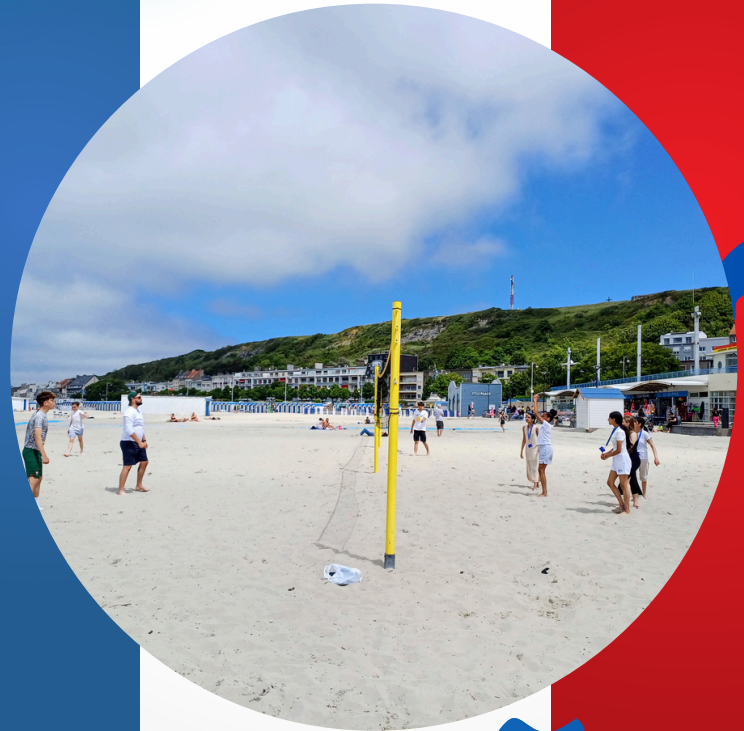


Year 9 Students Embark on a Memorable Trip to Paris!

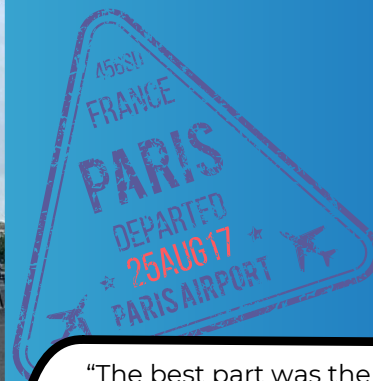
Sunny Beach Day

Year 7 Transition Champions Shine at Assembly

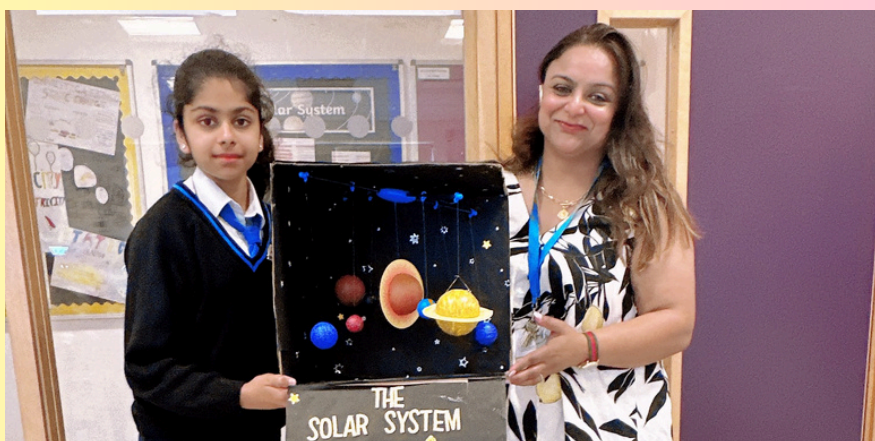

Check out this incredible model of the solar system created by Vishva from Year 9A3!

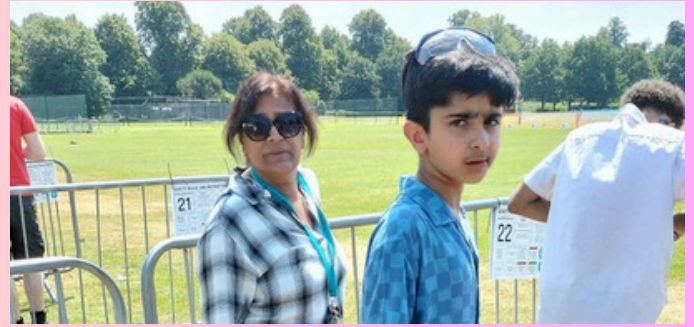

Our science students recently made a stellar impression at the district championships held at Teddington NPL!

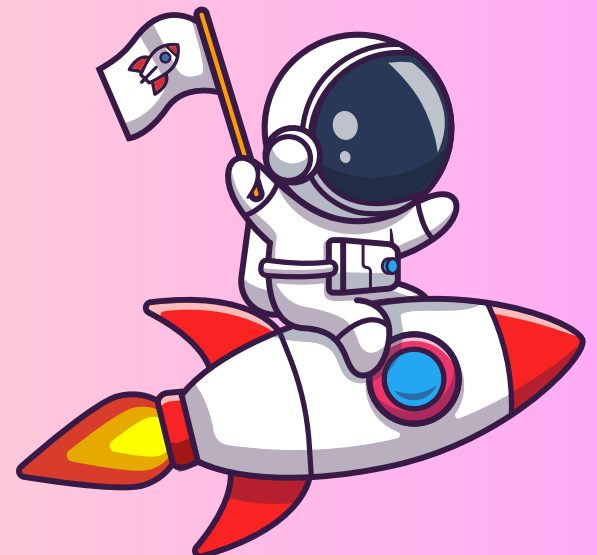
Competing against 45 teams, our five teams showcased their ingenuity and skills by launching rockets, with some even carrying delicate egg passengers.

This remarkable success highlights the dedication and talent of our science students.

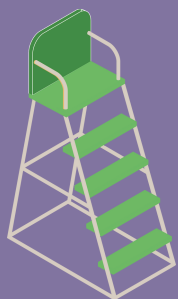

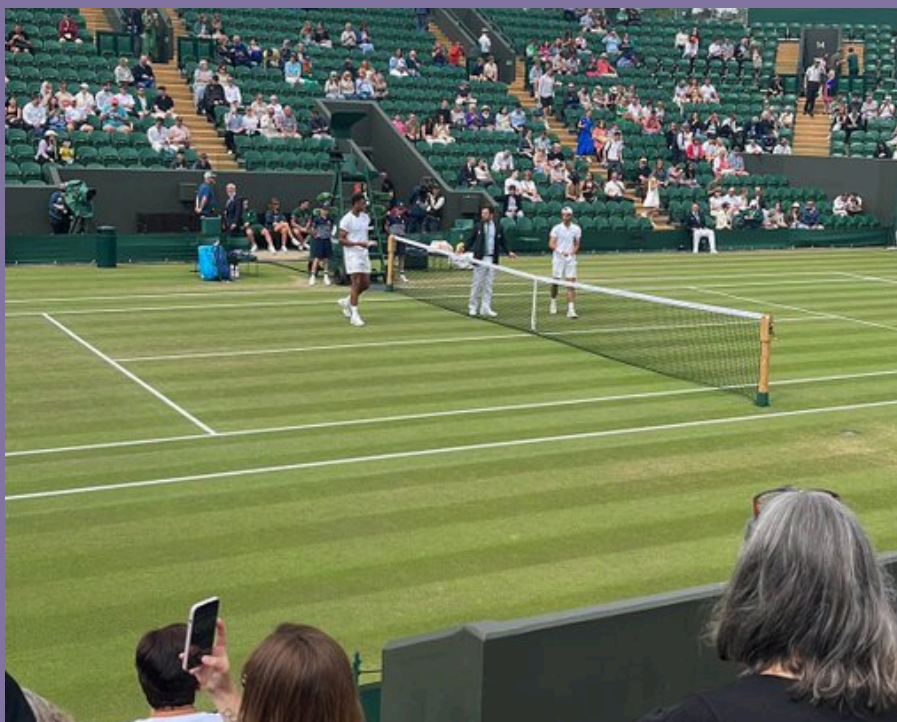


Wimbledon Kickoff: An Exciting First Match

Celebrity Spotting and Tennis Thrills

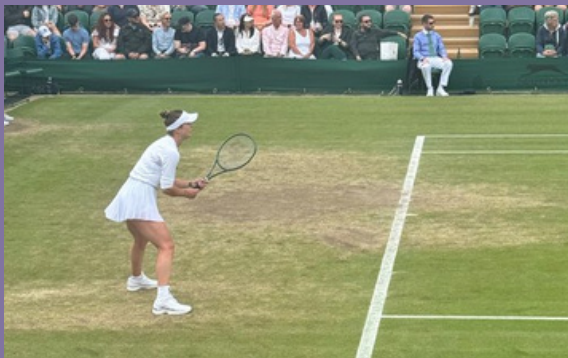
