Year 7 Explore the World of Charles Dickens

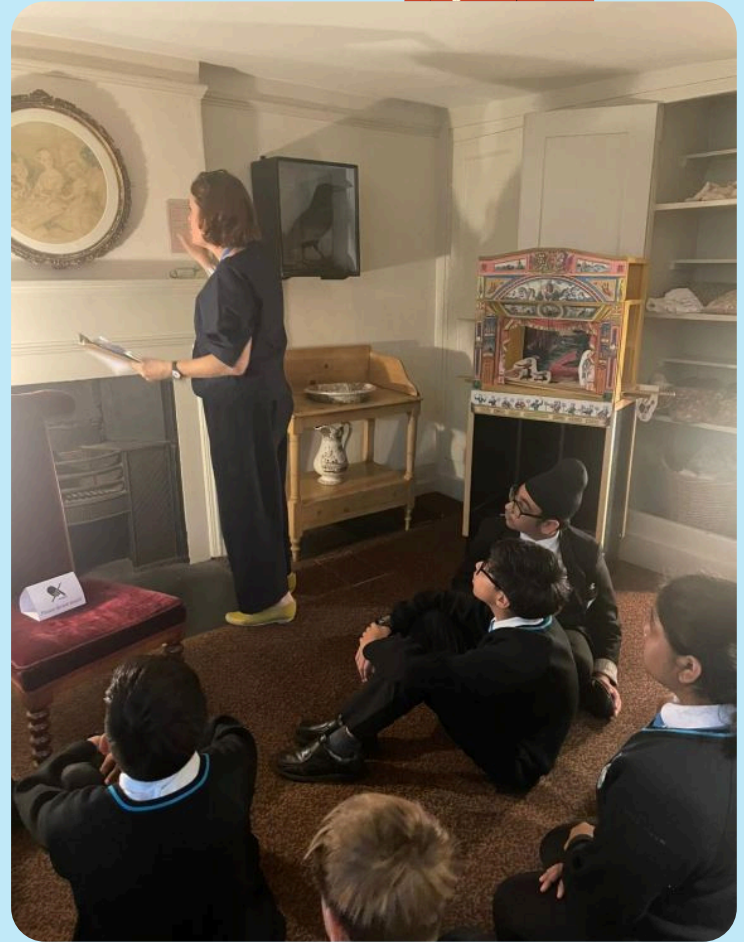


Our Year 7 students recently visited the Charles Dickens Museum in London for an unforgettable journey into the past.

Our science classes have been buzzing with creativity, discovery, and hands on learning!

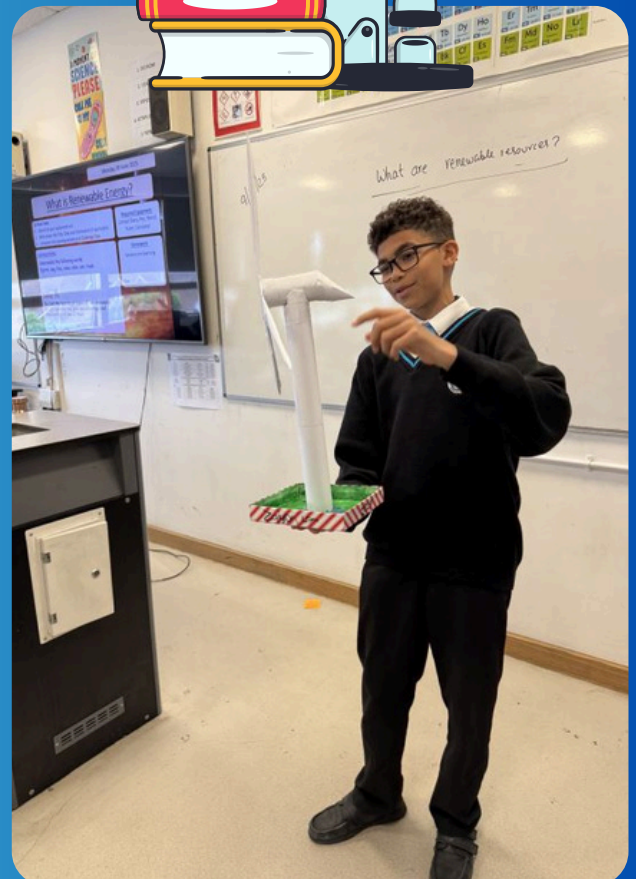
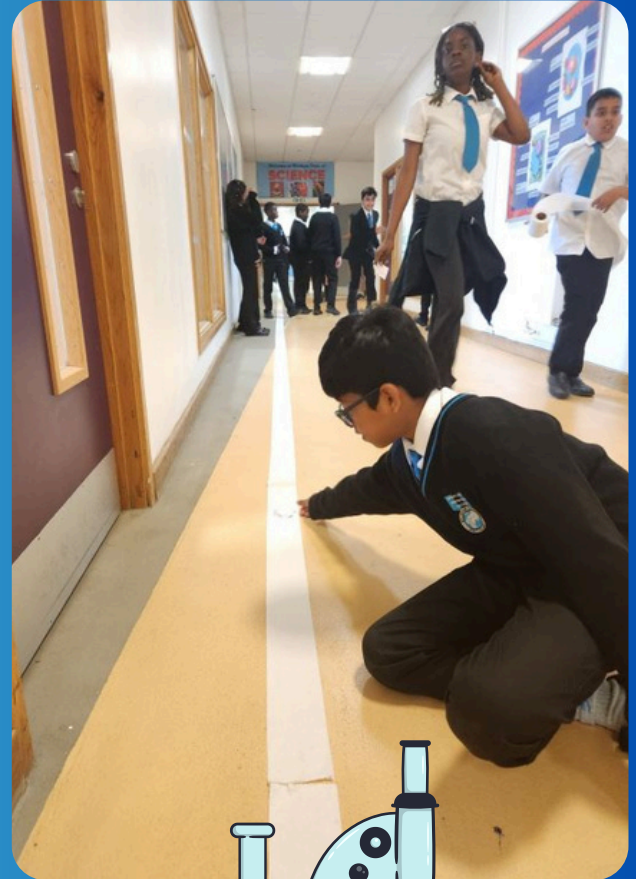
Mrs Sarkar's pupils have been busy creating models about energy and exploring renewable energy solutions.

On Tuesday 1st July, we were delighted to welcome our new Year 7 students from local primary feeder schools for their induction day.

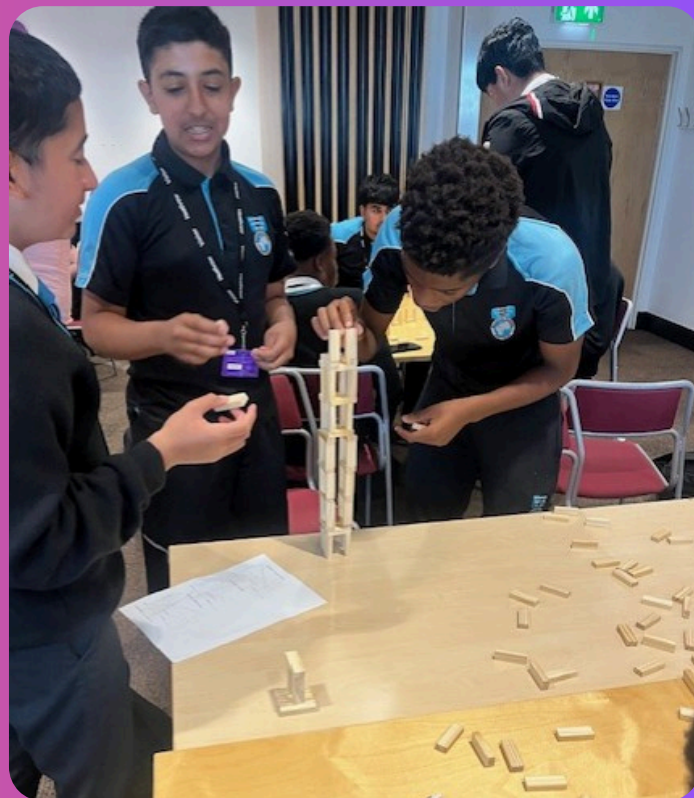


The day ran incredibly smoothly, giving pupils the chance to get to know their new school, meet staff, and begin forming friendships as they prepare for September.
