Recently, 42 of our Year 9 GCSE History students visited the Imperial War Museum London.

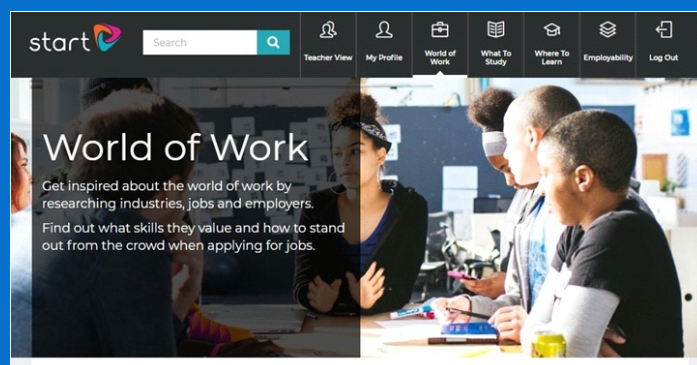
IWM is a family of five museums and historic sites covering war and conflict from the First World War to the present day.

Their sites and unique collection of objects tell the human stories of lives engulfed in war and show how conflict has shaped the world in which we all live.

IWM was founded in the midst of the First World War with a mission to preserve and tell the stories of all kinds of people, not only from Britain but from the countries of its empire.

As well as their permanent displays, they have a dynamic programme of temporary exhibitions, events and educational activities which helped our students to get close to the lives of those affected by war and to develop a deeper understanding of its effect on the world.
